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Summary of Actions to be taken

Continue to differentiate maths groups to support and challenge. With teachers teaching across 3 groups	Children in differentiated groups to enable support and more one-to one teaching. Curriculum tailored so that individuals can succeed and make progress.
Training for staff and language intervention programmes run in small groups,	Talk and write programme for younger children, Talking partners for KS2, Maths boost, Literacy support in small groups, Phonics groups. Handwriting boost, Communication leaders project, Dyslexia support by specialist teacher .Daily reading support for needy children. Staff to undergo award bearing training to help with diagnosis and recognition of need.
